

The significant efforts of the Committee to adapt events to suit the circumstances maintained, and in most cases, increased attendance and competition participation rates. Hats off to Elizabeth Riley who led the successful roll out of My Photo Club (MPC) and to Rob Champion who facilitated the smooth transition from face to face meetings to Zoom.

With MPC in place, digital images could be easily submitted as an alternative for prints. Plus Zoom meant we could enjoy club life from our loungeroom, get speakers from a wider field and easier collaboration with other camera clubs such as Redlands and BCG that expanded member access to online events beyond QCG.

During 'Lockdown' many of you also sought to explore new areas, using YouTube, tackling new tools, trying different techniques, and gaining more skills. There is now a fabulous pictorial legacy of the year through this evolving photography story and the overall skill level of the club has risen in many areas.

QCG Awards

In the last year, QCG with your images:

- QCG achieved first place to win the SEQ Awards and receive the coveted Angus Buchanan Award Trophy....thanks Esther as the driving force encouraging members to enter
- QCG also won the Interclub competition, having achieved the highest number of points (366) of any of the 16 clubs who submitted. A big thanks Rodney Nancarrow for leading the Interclub submissions for QCG.
- QCG also performed exceptionally well, having shared 10th position in the APS (Australian Photographic Society) 2020 Australia Cup Competition for Photography clubs Australia wide. Well done QCG in giving it a go and doing so well!

The Events

We've had some truly amazing speakers accessed from across the nation and the world, all cleverly sourced by Tony FitzGerald. These expanded our geographic horizons – at a time when we couldn't jump on a plane. Then to finish the year with the intended first speaker, Danielle Lancaster who gifted us her presence as the last speaker, was a pure jewel in the crown. She gave generously of her wide experience, offering multiple tips on all aspects of photography including the commercial perspective which was well received.

The Portrait Group organised by Gaye Edwards continues to be a signature highlight activity for QCG. Through the year, the scope expanded adding creativity to ideas for Portraiture both indoors and in natural light. November was the last event, a delightful outing at the Japanese Gardens Mt Cootha with Georgie Crossley's daughter Hayley kindly modelling for the grateful attendees.

The Photoshoots, organised by Esther Andrews were even more popular, giving a much welcome opportunity to get outdoors and see people again. Focus groups with Martin provided excellent learning experiences through highly skilled presenters offering their time. November was also a very busy month for the Riley team with Elizabeth and Martin co-ordinating judges for the judging of the two sets of images for Nature and social documentary then followed by creative and pictorial.

Focus Group—Danielle Lancaster



Danielle, a professional photographer and educator specialising in social documentation and tourism photojournalism was originally lined up as our first guest speaker of the year but had to pull out at the last minute when she was stranded on Tamborine Mountain due to flash flooding in early February. Little did we know what else 2020 had planned for us at that time. While she was unable to join us in February, Danielle did agree to regroup and speak to us at out final speaker meeting of the year.

Danielle inspired all with her informative dialogue about what it takes to sell images and gave a warning about ensuring the metadata attached to images was correct to protect copyright.

Nick Lefebvre mentioned he had one of his Namibian dune images, taken in 2015, lifted from his 500px profile and has been used over 4000 times without his permission! She gave us 11 top tips—see below.

Danielle's Top 11 Tips

- Learn to shoot a range of genres
- Learn to shoot using different techniques
- Develop your skills on and off the camera (eg people skills)
- Learn to write a caption
- Key word images
- Hash tag images on social media and don't overdo them
- Give space for text
- Give both horizontal and vertical options
- Look for connecting compositional tools to connect a series of images
- Look at the work of others
- Learn from experience

Competition Corner—Elizabeth Riley



Since the last PRISM, the club has held two November Judging nights for Aggregate competitions. On Nov 5th Paul Tilley judged Nature and Social Documentary, and on Nov 19th Elizabeth Kodela took us through Pictorial and Creative. These four topics are not usually part of the Aggregate competition; in previous years they would have comprised a separate 'Annuals' competition, with impact judging by a panel of three judges. This year, the difficulty in running an effective impact judging over Zoom saw these set subjects included in additional Aggregate competitions, with considered judging and feedback on every image. We were also very happy to be able to re-introduce Print competitions.

After that it was time for the 'Best of the Best'. Members submitted eligible images from their year's competition entries to determine the best DPI, Print, Mountain Landscape, Black and White Print, Portrait and Most Apt title of the Year. These competitions were judged behind closed doors by a panel of three PSQ judges. It was a little eerie walking into the Bardon Hall for the first time in 9 months. The judges, Margaret O'Grady, Anne Russell and Tryg Helander, enjoyed being back in the hall and were only slightly distracted by the rescue of a small scaly breasted lorikeet which was being attacked by other birds.

By the time you read this the Awards night, again via Zoom, will have been held on Dec 10, celebrating the achievements of the club as a whole and of individual members. Actual (as opposed to virtual) trophies will be handed out at a final face to face morning tea gathering.

I must admit to drawing a deep sigh of relief as the Camera Club year draws to an end. A new role for me, a new competition management system to learn, and a new way of delivering competition nights has certainly kept my brain active.

I would like to thank David Bullock for his willingness to answer any question I threw at him, and his continued support with both equipment and historical background. He obviously misses the job and has volunteered to be indoctrinated into the ways of MyPhotoClub to ensure there is always backup expertise, now that Chris Pigott is moving on to the role of Treasurer. So thank you also to Chris for backing me up this year, to Rob Champion and Jasmine Westerman for their Zoom night support, to Anne Pappalardo for her flyer expertise and finally to the Grading Panel of Tony Fitzgerald, Phil Lawrence and Jasmine Westerman.

And finally thank you to all QCG members for your willingness to adapt to so much that was new this year. The enthusiasm with which you have adopted MyPhotoClub has made my job very rewarding.






