And when you are ready to buy, Kate's code—WStock—will get you a 10% discount at the Lensbaby checkout!



Speaker - J P Stones

Storytelling for Photographers, Thursday 8 June, Zoom

It was a 3.00am start time for our remarkable, inspirational, and totally committed guest speaker this month, who braved the ridiculous time difference between his home base in Mexico and Queensland, to deliver one of our most interesting talks this year.

JP Stones is a portrait photographer who shared his quest to create not only a visual style for himself, but images that told a story. Tired of creating images that were simply 'pretty pictures', JP researched other techniques and photographers including Gregory Crewsdon, who he said put him on the track of *narrative photography*.

JP says that humans are wired for story telling, and that we are predisposed to try and give meaning to the meaningless.

He also says all good communication starts with an intention. So he began to work with more intention, making a new photo every week during Covid lockdowns, and posting them on Redit. His aim was to intentionally create an image around an emotion, and asked viewers what each image elicited to see if he could create work that had something specific to say.

This was the beginning of his journey from taking aesthetically beautiful portraits to images that were based in narrative. Focusing on the communication aspect rather than the aesthetic, JP says that in a successful image, the model is a character, rather than someone posing for an image. He also said cohesiveness creates narrative.

Some rules of thumb for making narrative portraits: (a) don't get attached to anything; the intention dictates everything; (b) if you light everything up, there's nothing left for a viewer to discover (leave some mystery); (c) you can't just throw smoke into every photo—you need to give it a reason to be there, and (d) don't have the model look at the camera (ask to look above or below the camera); if someone stares at the camera, they're breaking out of the story.




QCG Photographic Exhibition—Naturally

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APS News - In the Steps of Graham Burstow Street Photography Competition

The Graham Burstow Monochrome Prize has been established to honour of Graham Burstow OAM SAPS PSQA FFRPS FAPS EFIAP.

Graham was one of the founding members of the Australian Photographic Society, and since that time he contributed enormously to the Society and it's members.

He was involved in the establishment of the APS national and international exhibitions. Graham was the APS President from 1982 to 1984, and he was the Print Division Chairman for ten years.

Graham passed away at the age of 92 years in

He was a legend in the photography world, having been recognised by an Order of Australia Medal in 2004 for his services to photography. The first Queenslander to do so, he achieved a Fellowship in each of the Australian, British, and American Photographic Societies.

Graham's stunning photographs are held in many institutions around Australia, including the National Library in Canberra, and HOTA on the Gold Coast. His images show his great passion for street photography, especially in Mono.
